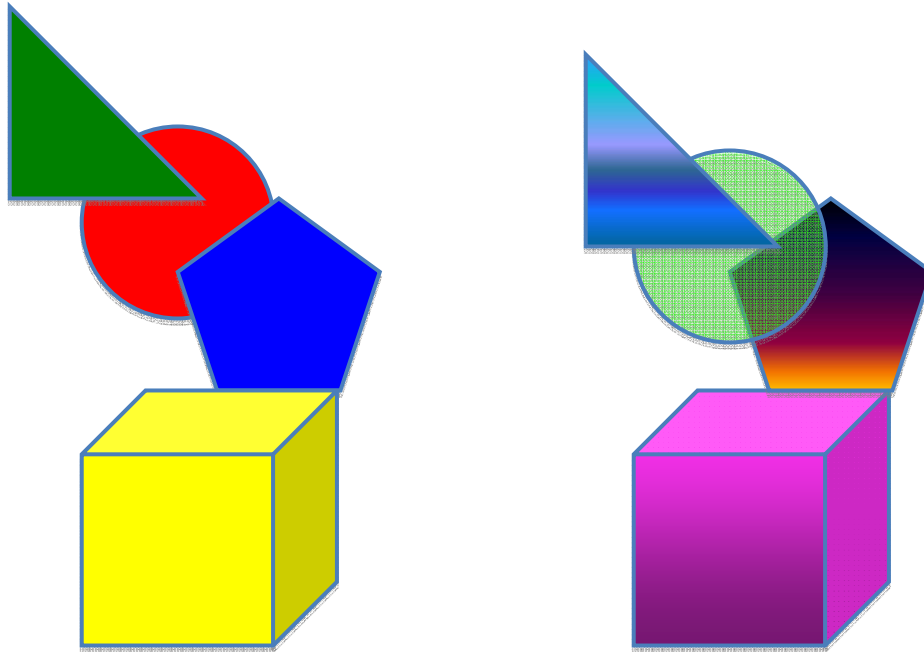


Twin Compositions, Different Colors

Remember to ask a grown-up at home for permission before you do this project!

Take these simple steps to create two works of art that are both the same and different!

- Draw a composition on a piece of paper. Make it simple or complex, realistic or abstract.
- Trace the exact same composition onto another piece of paper. A very easy way to trace a drawing is to tape the first drawing up on a window, and then tape a blank piece of paper on top of the drawing. The light showing through the window will help you see the lines from the paper that is beneath and make the tracing easy.
- Use realistic colors to color in one of the compositions. Any colored art material will work for this - crayons, markers, colored pencils, watercolors, or acrylics. Use a combination of art materials if you prefer.
- In the second composition, switch all the colors around.
- When you are finished, put the two works of art side by side. Which do you like better? How does the picture change when you switch around all the colors?
